
Time on Your Hands? Volunteer at the Museum

Maseum's Bas Fleet now Numbers 22 Vehicles

Fleet Manager, Dan Lehman reports that the MOBT now has 22 buses in its fleet. Of these 17, 14 are in excellent condition and ready for display at any time, two are in need of some work, and one will take a bit of restoration. It remains the Museum's policy to keep at least 11 vehicles on display at Hershey for public viewing and to switch displays every six months to keep the displays fresh.

The most recent acquisitions were the GMC 3207 transit bus donated by the Cambria County Transit Authority, and a 1987 MC-9 intercity coach from TransBridge Lines, Inc.

Two vehicles we are most interested in acquiring are an ACF IC-41 and a Ford Transit. By the time you read this we may have the ACF.

Annual Meeting Once Again a Success as a Fundraiser


Bus Day at the Museum of Bus Transportation last October 23rd brought a crowd of nearly 100.
